WATAUGA COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TUESDAY, AUGUST 21, 2012

The Watauga County Board of Commissioners held a regular meeting on Tuesday, August 21, 2012, at 5:30 P.M. in the Commissioners' Board Room of the Watauga County Administration Building, Boone, North Carolina.

Chairman Miller called the meeting to order at 5:30 P.M.

Commissioner Deal opened the meeting with a prayer and Vice-Chairman Gable led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Chairman Miller called for additions and/or corrections to the August 7, 2012, regular meeting and closed session minutes.

Commissioner Deal, seconded by Vice-Chairman Gable, moved to approve the August 7, 2012, regular meeting minutes as presented.

VOTE: Aye-5 Nay-0

Consideration of the August 7, 2012, closed session minutes was tabled until after closed session to allow the Board time to review a proposed amendment.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Chairman Miller called for additions and/or corrections to the August 21, 2012, agenda.

Chairman Miller stated that the following items were additions to the agenda: a request for the release of a fallen officer's badge and sidearm and consideration of a proposed proclamation declaring Constitution Week.

Vice-Chairman Gable, seconded by Commissioner Blust, moved to approve the August 21, 2012, agenda as amended.

VOTE: Aye-5 Nay-0

CONSIDERATION OF PROPOSED RESOLUTIONS

A. Honoring the Life and Service of Deputy William R. Mast, Jr.

Chairman Miller read a proposed resolution honoring Watauga County Deputy Sheriff William Ronald Mast, Jr.'s, life and service to his community. Deputy Mast was killed in the line of duty on July 26, 2012.

Commissioner Deal, seconded by Vice-Chairman Gable, moved to adopt the "Resolution Honoring the Life and Service of Deputy William R. Mast, Jr., Fallen Watauga County Deputy Sheriff," as presented.

VOTE: Aye-5 Nay-0

Chairman Miller presented the resolution to the Mast family.

B. Expressing the Appreciation of the Watauga County Board of Commissioners for the Assistance Rendered to Watauga County on July 26, 2012, and the Following Weeks

Chairman Miller read a proposed resolution expressing appreciation for the assistance received from other agencies and non-profits, throughout the County's recent tragedy which resulted in the death of Deputy Mast.

Commissioner Deal, seconded by Vice-Chairman Gable, moved to adopt the "Resolution Expressing the Appreciation of the Watauga County Board of Commissioners for the Assistance Rendered to Watauga County on July 26, 2012, and the Weeks Following," as presented.

VOTE: Aye-5 Nay-0

Chairman Miller directed the County Manager to send a copy of the resolution to each agency that assisted.

AWARD REQUEST FOR DECEASED OFFICER

Vice-Chairman Gable stated that Deputy William R. Mast, Jr.'s family had requested acquiring his sidearm and badge to become a part of a memorial in his honor. Per G. S. 20-187.2, governing bodies of a law enforcement agency may award to the family of a deceased law enforcement officer their badge and sidearm with the price for the side arm to be determined by the governing body. Currently, the North Carolina State Bureau of Investigation is in possession

of Deputy Mast's sidearm pending the conclusion of their investigation. A request was made for the respective sidearm and badge of Deputy William Ronald Mast be awarded to his family and that the Board set the price of the sidearm at \$1.

Vice-Chairman Gable, seconded by Commissioner Deal, moved to declare Deputy William R. Mast, Jr.'s badge and sidearm as surplus and award them to the family of Deputy William R. Mast, Jr., at a cost of \$1 for the sidearm, per G. S. 20-187.2 with the award to occur when the sidearm is released by the SBI upon the conclusion of their investigation.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION'S SMALL BUSINESS PARK PROPOSAL

Mr. Joe Furman, Economic Development Director, stated that the Board of Commissioners had previously approved marketing the old high school property as a business park while actively pursuing the sale of the property for commercial, residential or retail use. Mr. Furman stated that the lack of product was keeping the Department of Commerce from sending businesses to our County.

Mr. Tommy Sofield, EDC Board member and business owner, shared the benefits received by Watauga County as a result of the current Industrial Park and encouraged consideration of the EDC recommendation to create a small business park at the old Watauga High School (WHS) location. With the current Industrial Park full, a new park would allow for the expansion of current industry as well as the creation of new industry in the area.

Mr. Keith Honeycutt, EDC Chairman, shared that the Economic Development Commission had recently updated their mission statement, had studies conducted, and held an Economic Summit. The studies conducted showed that the retail/service sector generally followed economic growth rather than generate it. Mr. Honeycutt stated that the County needed industrial and office type positions such as those generated through a small business park. The EDC believes that utilizing the old WHS site as a small business park would better benefit the citizens in our area over a large retail site since export oriented jobs produced goods and services for sale to individuals and organizations outside of the County. The best way to grow the local economy would be to grow the export sector. Mr. Honeycutt stated that most of the businesses in the current industrial park as well as Appalachian State University and Samaritans Purse were export oriented. These types of jobs bring new income into the County and induce the growth of other sectors, such as retail and services.

Mr. Honeycutt stated that the old WHS site has been offered for sale as a single tract for mixed-use such as retail, restaurant, entertainment, and possibly housing. As such, the site would be disposed of in a single transaction, and upon development would generate sales tax revenue for local government. However, realistically, a portion of the sales tax generated would actually just be shifted from existing local businesses, which could lose sales to new development. The EDC believes the citizens of Watauga County would be well served by the alternative plan to develop a business park on the site as such a park would be dedicated to manufacturing, shipping,

research and development, and office uses. This type of park would generate little, if any, direct sales tax revenue, but would create significantly higher paying jobs than would retail and similar commercial uses. Both sales taxes and property taxes could increase as a result of spending by these businesses and their employees.

Mr. Honeycutt read the following recommendation from the EDC:

"Watauga County will clearly benefit from having protected sites available to market to manufacturing and other export oriented businesses and organizations. Therefore, we recommend that the Watauga County Board of Commissioners take action to formally designate the old WHS property as a business park (to be named later) with occupants restricted to export oriented businesses and organizations. Further, we recommend that the Watauga County Economic Development Commission be formally designated as the development and marketing agent for the property. In doing so, the current and future County Boards of Commissioners retain the responsibility of determining the appropriateness of park occupants and any local incentives used to help attract specific occupants."

After discussion, Chairman Miller tabled further discussion regarding the Small Business Park proposal and directed the County Manager to work with Mr. Joe Furman to schedule a joint meeting with the Economic Development Commission to further discuss the proposal.

REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF INSURANCE/RESPONSE MAPS

Mr. Jeff Virginia, Communications and Emergency Services Director, presented State-approved insurance/response maps for Boone, Deep Gap, Meat Camp, and Triplet tax districts which required Board approval.

Mr. Joe Furman stated that the maps, which were associated with the six-mile insurance initiative, had been previously approved by the Board of Commissioners then sent to the State where they were approved and sent back for additional Board approval.

Vice-Chairman Gable, seconded by Commissioner Futrelle, moved to approve the insurance/response maps for Boone, Deep Gap, Meat Camp, and Triplet tax districts as presented by Mr. Virginia.

[Clerk's Note: Chairman Miller abstained from the vote due to his residence being located within the area covered by the maps.]

HUNGER AND HEALTH COALITION PAVING REQUEST

Ms. Compton Fortuna, Director of the Hunger and Health Coalition, presented a request for paving repairs to Health Center Drive which services the Hunger and Health Coalition, Hospitality House, Caldwell Community College & Technical Institute, and non-profit agencies which sub-lease space in the Hannah Building from the Coalition. Ms. Fortuna had previously

requested assistance from the Board in November of 2011 and again in July 2012. Ms. Fortuna presented updated estimates that ranged from \$17,335 to \$39,628.35 for repaving and from \$6,989 to \$12,531 for the repair of existing potholes. Per the lease agreement for the County-owned Hannah Building, the Hunger and Health Coalition is responsible for upkeep and maintenance to the building and the County is responsible for providing property and liability and flood insurance for the facility.

Further discussion was tabled until the September 18, 2012, Board meeting to allow County staff time to explore options regarding the repairs requested.

PUBLIC HEARINGS TO ALLOW CITIZEN COMMENT

A. CDBG 2009 Scattered Site Housing Program Close-Out

Commissioner Deal, seconded by Commissioner Blust, declared the public hearing open at 6:32 P.M. to allow citizen comment on the closeout of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) 2009 Scattered Site Housing Program (SSHP) grant # 09-C2010.

CDBG grant administrator, Ms. Michelle Ball with the High Country Council of Governments, reported that Watauga County received \$400,000 for the three (3)-year program with the following expenditures:

- \$9,974.00 for clearance activities
- \$238.443.86 for relocation activities
- \$67,582.14 for rehabilitation activities
- \$47,000 for planning and administration
- \$39,845 for emergency repairs

Unexpended CDBG funds in the amount of \$155.00 were to be de-obligated for use in other CDBG funded programs. In addition to the \$400,000 Scattered Site funds awarded for this project, the County also received \$19,335.36 from the sale of a home that was rehabilitated in a previous grant cycle. The County was able to use those funds to extend the emergency repair portion of this project and treat four (4) additional homes.

There being no public comment, Vice-Chairman Gable, seconded by Commissioner Blust, moved to close the public hearing at 6:35 P.M.

B. CDBG 2012 Scattered Site Housing Program Pre-Application

Commissioner Deal, seconded by Commissioner Blust, moved to declare the public hearing open at 6:37 P.M. to allow citizen comment on the pre-application process for the 2012 Scattered Site Housing Program (SSHP) project.

Mr. Joe Furman, Planning Director, requested authorization to apply for the 2012 Community Development Block Grant funds in the Scattered Site Housing category in the amount of \$225,000 and in the NC Catalyst category in the amount of \$175,000. The CDBG funds will be used to rehabilitate houses occupied by very low-income households in Watauga County. Mr. Furman also requested that the High Country Council of Governments be designated to prepare the applications and administer the grants on behalf of the County.

There being no public comment, Vice-Chairman Gable, seconded by Commissioner Blust, moved to close the public hearing at 7:39 P.M.

PLANNING AND INSPECTIONS MATTERS

A. Proposed Amendments to the Gate Ordinance

Mr. Joe Furman, Planning Director, presented proposed technical amendments to the County's recently adopted Gate Ordinance. The first proposed amendment added an appeal process under the new section (100.09) and the second reworded Sections 100.04 A & B to clarify potentially confusing and conflicting language.

After discussion, Commissioner Blust, seconded by Vice-Chairman Gable, moved to schedule a public hearing at 6:00 P.M. on Tuesday, September 18, 2012, to allow citizen comment on the proposed ordinance amendments.

County Manager Geouque stated that approximately \$100,000 was budgeted for brush grinding in Fiscal Year 2013 and therefore recommended the approval of the \$18.00 per ton price with a not-to-exceed amount of \$100,000.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS:

Mr. Ralph Yates will present a resolution for the Board's consideration to name NC 194 Scenic Byway from Valle Crucis to the Avery County line in honor of Ed Yates. The procedures for naming roads/bridges/ferries by NCDOT have been included in your packet for review.

A Board member must endorse the request and present to the Committee and Board. A naming request reviewed and recommended by the Committee will be held for at least one month before being considered by the full Board.

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE NAMING OF A PORTION OF NC 194 MISSION CROSSING SCENIC BYWAY IN HONOR OF ED YATES

WHEREAS, the Ed Yates family has lived in Watauga County since the 1870's with strong ties to the community; and

WHEREAS, Ed Yates had a special interest in machinery and electricity and learned to operate a steam shovel; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Department of Transportation recognized Mr. Yates' ability with equipment and hired him to build roads for the State of North Carolina and the Citizens of Watauga County; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Yates was instrumental in the construction of NC 194 from Todd to Elk Park, NC 88 from Warrensville, NC, to Trade, TN, and US 321 from Boone to Blowing Rock; and

WHEREAS, Ed Yates was a community leader and, in many ways, ahead of his time by understanding machinery and how new inventions such as the automobile and electricity could have a significant improvement on the lives of those in the community; and

WHEREAS, Blue Ridge Electric Membership Corporation could not have had a better advocate than Mr. Yates in promoting the benefits of electricity; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Yates was the 10,000th member of Blue Ridge Electric Membership Corporation; and

WHEREAS, upon his retirement from the North Carolina Department of Transportation, Ed Yates operated his farm and continued his service to the community by loaning equipment and assistance to his neighbors.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Watauga County Board of Commissioners supports the naming of a 4.2 mile section of NC 194 Mission Crossing Scenic Byway from Valle Crucis to Hade Smith Road Intersection in Honor of Ed Yates.

Subject: The naming of NC 194 Scenic Byway from Vallie Crucis to the Avery County line in honor of Ed Yates (posthumously).

Mr. Chairman, this is a request to the commission, asking that they consider naming NC 194 Scenic Byway (posthumously) in honor of Ed Yates of the Matney/Cool Springs Community.

The Yates's have been land owners in Watauga County since around 1870. Ed Yates's Grandfather Alford Yates a Civil War Veteran who enlisted in the Confederate Army on June 12, 1861. Alford Yates was engaged in the battle for Gettysburg Pa. Other battles was the "Bloody Angle," the "Wilderness campaign" and finally the battle at Spotsylvania Courthouse, where more than 10,000men on both sides had been killed, wounded, or captured. Alf Yates was one of the Confederate soldiers taken as a prisoner of war that day. He was taken to camp Point Lookout a stretch of sand thrusting into the Chesapeake Bay. The death rate at Point Lookout was reported at 30%. One option offered the prisoners' at Point Lookout was to pledge allegiance to the Union and go fight the Plains Indians in the Dakota Territory. Alf Yates took this option and records show that he was present in July 1865 at Fort Rice, ND. Alf Yates returned to his home on Reedy's Branch in Wilkes County until 1869. He then moved to Stony Fork in Watauga County and in 1875 moved to the Cool Springs Community in the Shawneehaw Twp. They settled on a 231 acre tract on the water of Laurel Fork on the east end of Beech Mountain. He built a ten room two story house on the property that is still in the Yates family today. All of the Yates's were farmers and two of the brothers Ed & Calvin had large farms in the Cool Springs Community and two Coy & Fred owned large farms in the Vallie Crucus area. These farms are still in the family's today.

Ed Yates was interested in machinery and eventually learned to operate a steam shovel and build roads for the NCDOT. These were powerful machines powered by steam and one shovel was assigned to several counties. From all reports Ed was a gifted operator and road builder. Some of the roads he helped build was NC 194 from Todd to Elk Park. NC 88 from Warrensville to Trade. US 321 from Boone to Blowing Rock. On the NC 194 project The Big S as it is know by locals has always been a problem, with many

tractors hung up on the Big S taking hours to untangle. When NC 194 was being built Ed told the engineer that he could lay out and build a better road if he would leave the Big S out and let him gradually bring the road on around and up the mountain. The engineer told him that the Big S would be a huge tourist attraction as two bus lines made daily runs from Charlotte to Johnson City TN. Keep in mind that these roads were built before bulldozers, motor graders, track holes, or large dump trucks came on the scene. Horse drawn drags, sleds, rakes and shovels was the tools of choice.

Ed Yates was a community leader and in many ways he was ahead of his time by understanding machinery and what new inventions such as automobiles and electricity would mean to his world. Ed would hold community meetings in his home and have BREMCO officials com and explain what electricity could do for them and make their lives better. Ed and his family was recognized as the 10,000 member of BREMCO. After his retirement from the NCDOT Ed operated his farm and made use of many of the new equipment and improved farming techniques. He was always willing to loan this equipment to his neighbors and help them to understand the operation of the equipment. Ed Yates was a trusted man and leader in his community and it was common knowledge that his word was his bond.

Mr. Chairman your consideration in this matter will be appreciated.

PROCEDURES FOR NAMING ROADS/BRIDGES/FERRIES

The following documentation and information is required before any naming request will be considered by the Board of Transportation.

nation to be provided by the local nominating entity:
1. Background information on nominee. Sufficient information must be provided to explain why the naming is warranted; for example, local, state, and/or national contributions and accomplishments. If the designee is recently deceased, the request will be reviewed after a one year waiting period.
2. Description of what is requested to be named. The Board will consider naming Ferries, Interstate, US, and NC routes/bridges only, or more significant bridges on the state's secondary road system. The distance of dedication should be approximately 5 miles or less. Law enforcement officers will be honored with bridge dedications in lieu of highways.
3. Resolutions from all local governing bodies associated with or affected by the request. City or town councils and/or county commissioners must adopt resolutions in sufficient detail to adequately justify the request.
4. Strong public input and support. Explain the degree to which the public supports the request and had notice of action with an opportunity for input.
OT Staff Review:
5. Whether another facility has been previously named by the BOT. The Board does not name more than one facility for the same individual. Requests for duplicate family members reviewed on case by case basis.
6. If the facility is planned or under construction, expected completion date. The Board typically does not name facilities until approximately three months prior to completion.
7. Opposition. The Board does not mediate local disagreements.

Board member must endorse request and present to Committee and Board.
NCDOT Secretary and Board Chairman are Co-Chairs of the Committee and call meetings and approve the agenda.

SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION TO ASSIST WITH ROAD/BRIDGE NAMING REQUESTS FROM INDIVIDUALS AND GOVERNMENTS:

- The requesting party should have the family's support for the road or bridge naming request including agreement with the requested location of the dedication.
- The requested wording to appear on the actual signs needs to be stated in the resolution by the local government (with the family's concurrence) to insure the signs are manufactured correctly. Final wording is at the Department's discretion.
- Interstate designations will use the wording "Freeway" and NC & US roadways designation will use the wording "Highway".
- Local governments could consider the "Adopt a Highway" program as an alternative method of honoring an individual or group.
- The Board does not typically name a facility for accident victims. An
 individual's accomplishments and contributions to the state and community
 are used as criteria for consideration for a memorial designation.
- It is the responsibility of the individual seeking the road or bridge naming request to work directly with the local government to obtain the necessary resolution for submittal to the Board.
- Municipalities may name municipally owned streets or bridges in honor of individuals or groups. This does not require DOT review or approval.
- It is the Board's opinion that the Blue Star Memorial Highway designation honors all veterans and military groups in the state. Therefore, any other designation of a road or structure for veterans or military groups would be considered duplication.
- Honorary signs will be ground mounted; overhead signs will not be installed.
 Signs will be installed at the beginning and ending termini of the approved roadway segment, and will not be installed on exits, Y-lines, or intersecting roadways.
- Signs will not include titles except for certain designations as determined by the committee (i.e. Trooper, Congressman, Governor).
- Dedications for law enforcement officers are for North Carolina officers killed in the line of duty.

This is to request the Watauga County Commission include an agenda item on the September 18, 2012 meeting to accept the Watauga County Drug Treatment Court enhancement grant awarded by the US Dept. of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance.

The award is for \$91,629 for two years (see attached). The award is being matched by ABC funds (approximately \$30,543) for a total project cost of \$122,172. The County Commission authorized submission of the grant by MRJC and the use of ABC funds as match at its February 21st and March 6th meetings.

Standard federal award terms and special conditions apply to this grant (see attached). The Board of Directors of MRJC, as sub-grantee, met on August 29, 2012 to acknowledge these terms and conditions and our intent to comply with them, including any necessary revisions to our Personnel Policies and Procedures.

An abstract of the grant is attached after the award documents and conditions. I will be happy to answer any questions regarding the BJA Grant or the Drug Treatment Court Program at the meeting on September 18th.



Applicant Information Page

A. Abstract:

Watauga County, North Carolina is requesting Drug Court Discretionary Grant Program funds in the amount of \$122,172 for enhancement of an adult drug treatment court to assist certain nonviolent offenders attain successful rehabilitation from the abuse of alcohol and other drugs and to reduce criminal recidivism.

The intent of the drug court enhancements will be to expand services to high risk, high need offenders and increase the program's effectiveness at reducing recidivism. This will be accomplished by:

- aggressively developing a more coordinated and consistent process for identifying the target population (the high risk, high need offenders who have the most potential to benefit from the program),
- modifying the screening process for eligible participants to enable the
 development of more individualized treatment plans that take into account issues
 (such as age, gender, military status, co-occurring mental health issues, type of
 drug used, trauma experiences, housing issues, legal issues, and
 employment/education issues) that have been consistently identified in the
 research as having a significant impact on the effectiveness of drug and alcohol
 treatment programs,
- improving offender management through more increased and randomized drug screening, and,

 developing a more comprehensive data collection and evaluation process to further our understanding of 'what works' in our rural community (and perhaps can be a model for other rural communities).

The maximum capacity to be served with federal assistance over the life of the grant is fifty (50) participants, with the expectation that half will either have graduated or be actively engaged and compliant with the program at the end of the two years. The total number of clients served through information, referral, and consultation is estimated to be eighty (80).

The Watauga Drug Court Program is meeting and will continue to meet the following Key Components of a drug court:

- Drug courts integrate alcohol and other drug treatment (substance abuse) services with justice system case processing.
- Using a non-adversarial approach, prosecution and defense counsel promote public safety while protecting participants' due process rights.
- Eligible participants are identified early and promptly placed in the drug court program.
- Drug courts provide access to a continuum of alcohol, drug, and other related treatment and rehabilitation services.
- 5. Abstinence is monitored by frequent alcohol and other drug testing.
- 6. A coordinated strategy governs drug court responses to participants' compliance.
- 7. Ongoing judicial interaction with each drug court participant is essential.
- Monitoring and evaluation measure the achievement of program goals and gauge effectiveness.

- Continuing interdisciplinary education promotes effective drug court planning, implementation and operations.
- Forging partnerships among drug courts, public agencies and community-based organizations generate local support and enhances drug court effectiveness.

Five (5) of seven (7) of the evidenced-based program design features will be implemented in the project, as follows:

- B. This funding is requested for enhancement (Category 2) to a county Adult Drug Court program with a rural population.
- C. Watauga County is not designated as an Empowerment Zone or Renewal Community by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.
- D. Watauga County is not currently collaborating with a Second Chance or other Office of Justice Programs-funded initiative. However, the County was recently a recipient of a Community-Based Youth Gang Prevention Grant, Assessment Phase, and subsequently, Implementation Phase, from federal Byrne/JAG funds from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, utilizing Department of Justice, Office of Justice Program Guidelines. The County and the County's Drug Treatment Court Provider, the Mediation

- and Restorative Justice Center, have been awarded and successfully implemented several North Carolina Governor's Crime Commission grants which derive from Department of Justice Funding.
- E. Watauga County has never received a Drug Court grant from the Office of Justice Programs, but the Watauga Drug Court team has participated in the Drug Court Planning Initiative and various OJA- and State Drug Court-funded conferences and National Association of Drug Court Professionals trainings.

Congratulations on your recent award. In establishing financial assistance programs, Congress linked the receipt of Federal funding to compliance with Federal civil rights laws. The Office for Civil Rights (OCR), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), U.S. Department of Justice is responsible for ensuring that recipients of financial aid from OJP, its component offices and bureaus, the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW), and the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) comply with applicable Federal civil rights statutes and regulations. We at OCR are available to help you and your organization meet the civil rights requirements that come with Justice Department funding.

Ensuring Access to Federally Assisted Programs

As you know, Federal laws prohibit recipients of financial assistance from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, or disability in funded programs or activities, not only in respect to employment practices but also in the delivery of services or benefits. Federal law also prohibits funded programs or activities from discriminating on the basis of age in the delivery of services or benefits.

Providing Services to Limited English Proficiency (LEP) Individuals

In accordance with Department of Justice Guidance pertaining to Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 U.S.C. § 2000d, recipients of Federal financial assistance must take reasonable steps to provide meaningful access to their programs and activities for persons with limited English proficiency (LEP). For more information on the civil rights responsibilities that recipients have in providing language services to LEP individuals, please see the website at http://www.lep.gov.

Ensuring Equal Treatment for Faith-Based Organizations

The Department of Justice has published a regulation specifically pertaining to the funding of faith-based organizations. In general, the regulation, Participation in Justice Department Programs by Religious Organizations; Providing for Equal Treatment of all Justice Department Program Participants, and known as the Equal Treatment Regulation 28 C.F.R. part 38, requires State Administering Agencies to treat these organizations the same as any other applicant or recipient. The regulation prohibits State Administering Agencies from making award or grant administration decisions on the basis of an organization's religious character or affiliation, religious name, or the religious composition of its board of directors.

The regulation also prohibits faith-based organizations from using financial assistance from the Department of Justice to fund inherently religious activities. While faith-based organizations can engage in non-funded inherently religious activities, they must be held separately from the Department of Justice funded program, and customers or beneficiaries cannot be compelled to participate in them. The Equal Treatment Regulation also makes clear that organizations participating in programs funded by the Department of Justice are not permitted to discriminate in the provision of services on the basis of a beneficiary's religion. For more information on the regulation, please see OCR's website at http://www.ojp.usdoj.gov/ocr/etfbo.htm.

State Administering Agencies and faith-based organizations should also note that the Safe Streets Act, as amended; the Victims of Crime Act, as amended; and the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act, as amended, contain prohibitions against discrimination on the basis of religion in employment. Despite these nondiscrimination provisions, the Justice Department has concluded that the Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA) is reasonably construed, on a case-by-case basis, to require that its funding agencies permit faith-based organizations applying for funding under the applicable program statutes both to receive DOJ funds and to continue considering religion when hiring staff, even if the statute that authorizes the funding program generally forbids considering of religion in employment decisions by grantees.

Questions about the regulation or the application of RFRA to the statutes that prohibit discrimination in employment may be directed to this Office.

Enforcing Civil Rights Laws

All recipients of Federal financial assistance, regardless of the particular funding source, the amount of the grant award, or the number of employees in the workforce, are subject to the prohibitions against unlawful discrimination. Accordingly, OCR investigates recipients that are the subject of discrimination complaints from both individuals and groups. In addition, based on regulatory criteria, OCR selects a number of recipients each year for compliance reviews, audits that require recipients to submit data showing that they are providing services equitably to all segments of their service population and that their employment practices meet equal employment opportunity standards.

Complying with the Safe Streets Act or Program Requirements

In addition to these general prohibitions, an organization which is a recipient of financial assistance subject to the nondiscrimination provisions of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act (Safe Streets Act) of 1968, 42 U.S.C. § 3789d(c), or other Federal grant program requirements, must meet two additional requirements:(1) complying with Federal regulations pertaining to the development of an Equal Employment Opportunity Plan (EEOP), 28 C.F.R. § 42.301-.308, and (2) submitting to OCR Findings of Discrimination (see 28 C.F.R. §§ 42.205(5) or 31.202(5)).

1) Meeting the EEOP Requirement

In accordance with Federal regulations, Assurance No. 6 in the Standard Assurances, COPS Assurance No. 8.B, or certain Federal grant program requirements, your organization must comply with the following EEOP reporting requirements:

If your organization has received an award for \$500,000 or more and has 50 or more employees (counting both full- and part-time employees but excluding political appointees), then it has to prepare an EEOP and submit it to OCR for review within 60 days from the date of this letter. For assistance in developing an EEOP, please consult OCR's website at http://www.ojp.usdoj.gov/ocr/eeop.htm. You may also request technical assistance from an EEOP specialist at OCR by dialing (202) 616-3208.

If your organization received an award between \$25,000 and \$500,000 and has 50 or more employees, your organization still has to prepare an EEOP, but it does not have to submit the EEOP to OCR for review. Instead, your organization has to maintain the EEOP on file and make it available for review on request. In addition, your organization has to complete Section B of the Certification Form and return it to OCR. The Certification Form can be found at http://www.ojp.usdoj.gov/ocr/eeop.htm.

If your organization received an award for less than \$25,000; or if your organization has less than 50 employees, regardless of the amount of the award; or if your organization is a medical institution, educational institution, nonprofit organization or Indian tribe, then your organization is exempt from the EEOP requirement. However, your organization must complete Section A of the Certification Form and return it to OCR. The Certification Form can be found at http://www.ojp.usdoj.gov/ocr/eeop.htm.

2) Submitting Findings of Discrimination

In the event a Federal or State court or Federal or State administrative agency makes an adverse finding of discrimination against your organization after a due process hearing, on the ground of race, color, religion, national origin, or sex, your organization must submit a copy of the finding to OCR for review.

Ensuring the Compliance of Subrecipients

If your organization makes subawards to other agencies, you are responsible for assuring that subrecipients also comply with all of the applicable Federal civil rights laws, including the requirements pertaining to developing and submitting an EEOP, reporting Findings of Discrimination, and providing language services to LEP persons. State agencies that make subawards must have in place standard grant assurances and review procedures to demonstrate that they are effectively monitoring the civil rights compliance of subrecipients.

The purpose of the Drug Court Discretionary Grant Program is to provide financial and technical assistance to states, state courts, local courts, units of local government, and Indian tribal governments to develop and implement drug treatment courts that effectively integrate substance abuse treatment, mandatory drug testing, sanctions and incentives, and transitional services in a judicially supervised court setting with jurisdiction over nonviolent, substance-abusing offenders.

None of the following activities will be conducted whether under the Office of Justice Programs federal action or a related third party action:

- (1) New construction.
- (2) Any renovation or remodeling of a property located in an environmentally or historically sensitive area, including property (a) listed on or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places, or (b) located within a 100-year flood plain, a wetland, or habitat for an endangered species.
- (3) A renovation that will change the basic prior use of a facility or significantly change its size.
- (4) Research and technology whose anticipated and future application could be expected to have an effect on the environment.
- (5) Implementation of a program involving the use of chemicals.

Additionally, the proposed action is neither a phase nor a segment of a project that when reviewed in its entirety would not meet the criteria for a categorical exclusion.

Consequently, the subject federal action meets the Office of Justice Programs' criteria for a categorical exclusion as contained in paragraph 4(b) of Appendix D to Part 61 of Title 28 of the Code of Federal Regulations.



This is a recommendation from the Watauga County Comprehensive

Transportation Plan Steering Committee. As the committee reviewed the

deficiencies and recommendations for the comprehensive transportation plan

(CTP), it was determined that US 421 from Vilas to Tennessee was better suited as
a Strategic Highway Corridor and Intrastate Highway Trust Fund project than US 321 from Vilas
to Tennessee. US 321 does provide a direct connection to Johnson City, Tennessee which is
considered an activity center. However, US 421 from Vilas to Tennessee provides a more direct
connection to I-81 in Virginia. The route to I-81 would include US 421 north to Mountain City,
then Tennessee Route 91 to Damascus, and finally US 58 to I-81. The committee believed the
proposed change would benefit Watauga County for the following reasons:

- 1. US 421 provides a more direct connection to an interstate.
- 2. Future improvements to US 19E will make it a better connection to Johnson City than US 321.
- 3. US 421 currently has twice the Average Annual Daily Traffic (AADT) at the Tennessee state line as US 321 at the Tennessee state line and would be more likely to need improvement in the future (US 421 AADT is 5,800 and US 321 AADT is 2,900).
- 4. Virginia DOT is widening US 58 between Abingdon and Damascus to a four lane facility.
- 5. Tennessee DOT is doing a study of a possible widening of Tennessee Route 91.
- 6. Johnson County, TN has expressed support of an improvement of US 421 between Mountain City and Boone.
- 7. The estimate to widen US 421 from Vilas to Tennessee is a little over half as much as the widening estimate for US 321 from Vilas to Tennessee. (\$67,900,000 vs. 132,900,000).
- 8. US 321 passes through the Pisgah National Forest and is located very near the Watauga River and Watauga Lake. There would be many environmental concerns associated with any widening of US 321.

Outcomes if approved:

- US 421 from Vilas to Tennessee would be eligible for funding through the Intrastate Highway Trust fund.
- 2. US 421 from Vilas to Tennessee would be identified as an Expressway in the Strategic Highway Corridors Vision Plan.
 - Expressway Characteristics:
 - Speed Limit: 50 to 60 mph

In addition, NCDOT Division 11 Engineer Mike Pettyjohn has been consulted and has indicated support for the change.

Next Steps:

- If the county approves the recommendation, the High Country RPO would submit the requested changes to NCDOT.
- NCDOT will review the request for the Strategic Highway Corridor Change and provide a response.
- NCDOT will review the request to designate US 421 from Vilas to Tennessee as an Intrastate Highway Trust Fund project and provide guidance on requesting a change to the General Statute which identifies Intrastate Highway Trust Fund projects.

WHEREAS, the Watauga County Comprehensive Transportation Plan Steering Committee has evaluated the intrastate and strategic highway corridor network within Watauga County and supports this request.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Watauga County Board of Commissioners endorses the request for the removal of US 321 from Vilas to Tennessee from the Strategic Highway Corridor map and from the list of Intrastate Trust Fund projects in GS 136-178 and 136-179 and requests that it be replaced on the Strategic Highway Corridor map and on the list of Intrastate Trust Fund projects with improvements to US 421 from Vilas to Tennessee.

B. Bid Award Request for Paving Repairs at the Hannah Building

MANAGER'S COMMENTS:

At the August 21, 2012 Board meeting, staff was given direction to assist the Hunger and Health Coalition in securing pricing for driveway repairs and the potential to utilize County staff to reduce the cost. The County solicited four (4) paving contractors for the repairs in which Carl Rose and Sons did not bid. The contractors were requested to provide three (3) options; Option 1 was to dig out and patch the five (5) pothole areas, Option 2 was to dig out and patch the five (5) pothole areas and tar and gravel the driveway, Option 3 was to dig out the entire driveway and replace with two (2) inch pavement. In addition to these options, County staff recommends that a portion of the driveway that is being utilized for firewood drop-off not be repaved but graveled to accommodate the weight loads of the wood. This would add an additional \$1,200 to each of the options or could be removed.

Utilizing County equipment and staff would reduce Option 1 and 2 by \$600, and Option 3 by \$1,050.

Staff concurs with the Board that patching only the pothole areas is not the ideal fix and would recommend Option 2 or 3, if the Board so chooses to proceed forward.

100.01 AUTHORITY AND PURPOSE

This ordinance is enacted pursuant to the general police powers granted to Watauga County by North Carolina Gen. Stat. §153A-121, N.C. Gen. Stat. §153A-352, and Section 503 of the 2009 North Carolina State Fire Prevention Code. The purpose of this ordinance is to establish rules and standards for the installation of electronic access gates for gated communities in order to provide for the safe and efficient ingress and egress for fire, law enforcement, and other emergency personnel.

100.02 DEFINITIONS

For the purposes of this section, the following words shall have the following meanings:

<u>Key Box</u>: A secure, tamperproof device with a lock operable only by a fire department, police department, or emergency services department master key, and containing building entry keys and other such devices that may be required for access in an emergency.

<u>Gated Community</u>: A development that is enclosed within a geographical area by restrictive gates.

<u>Gates</u>: A crossbar, door, or other obstructive device which is utilized for the purpose of restricting, controlling, or obstructing entry or exit by motor vehicles or pedestrians to or from a private roadway.

<u>Ingress/Egress</u>: The point where vehicles or pedestrians enter and exit a development.

<u>Modifications</u>: Any structural changes from the original configuration (new or existing), change from manual to electric, change of electronic control operation or alterations requiring a permit.

<u>Private Streets</u>: Internal streets that are not owned or maintained by North Carolina Department of Transportation and that are owned and maintained by an entity responsible for upkeep and maintenance, such as a homeowners association, community group, property management company, or similar organization.

100.03 REQUIREMENTS

New and existing, when applicable, gated communities shall comply with the following requirements:

- A. All streets in the gated community must be private streets.
- B. The location of the gate(s) shall comply with Section 100.04 of this ordinance and the North Carolina State Fire Prevention Code, as applicable.
- C. The gates shall be maintained in working order and inspected as needed.
- D. Gates pre-existing to the adoption of this ordinance shall not be affected by this ordinance provided they are maintained and in working order. If such gates are replaced or modified, they shall conform to the requirements of Sections 100.04, parts C through K, of this ordinance and the North Carolina State Fire Prevention Code as applicable.
- E. Applicants shall adhere to section 100.05 below regarding the process for obtaining approval for gates.

100.04 GATE DEVELOPMENT SPECIFICS

A. Entrance ways and exit ways shall be a minimum of twenty (20) feet unobstructed width. When separated by medians, posts or other obstructions, each entrance and exit lane shall be provided with a minimum unobstructed width of twelve (12) feet. There shall also be at least 40' measured from the gate to the ultimate right-of-way so the fire truck or emergency vehicle will not block the adjacent public right of way.

- A. Entrance gates shall be located a minimum of 40' from the adjacent public road right-of-way to allow for emergency vehicle clearance at entry.
- B. The ingress/egress area at the gate location shall be separated by a minimum 5' landscape island.
- B. Combined entry and exit ways shall provide a minimum unobstructed width of twenty (20) feet. Entry and exit ways separated by landscape medians, guard houses, or other obstructions shall provide a minimum unobstructed width of twelve (12) feet. Entry and exit ways shall have a minimum unobstructed vertical clearance of not less than thirteen feet six inches (13'6").
- C. It shall be determined if the gates are to be manual or electrical in operation. All electrical vehicular gates shall be provided with access control using a Radio Transceiver for public safety and authorized users. This transceiver will allow emergency vehicles to open the gate from a mobile or portable radio, and must be pre-approved by Watauga County.
- D. All electrical vehicular gates shall be provided with a fail-open device in the event of power failures unless secondary power is provide by battery back-up or generator. During a power failure, the gates will open and remain open. These devices should restore the gate(s) to the closed position after the power is restored. Any residential gated communities consisting of three (3) or less dwelling units are not subject to this requirement.
- E. Gates need to be opened for appropriate personnel to enter the community during an emergency. A fire service recognized/approved dual key activating switch or padlock shall be installed to allow emergency personnel access through vehicular gates.
- F. An approved dual key lock box containing cards, keys, pass codes and

operating instructions shall be provided at each entrance gate.

- G. Gates shall be designed so that when fully opened do not obstruct the path of travel for vehicles or pedestrians, whether emergency and non-emergency. Gates shall remain fully open during an emergency event, when activated by responding agency, until reset. A 'Hold Open' code must be included in design and functioning of the gate.
- H. If there are two or more gates in any single development, all gates shall be operated in the same fashion.
- I. Gate activation shall not be altered or placed out of service without prior notification to the Watauga County Fire Marshal's Office, Watauga County Planning and Inspections Department and the Local Fire Department.
- J. Each entrance gate shall be provided with an "override" feature to allow the gate(s) to remain open so that multiple fire apparatus can enter without having to wait for intermittent opening of the gate(s).
- K. Each entrance gate shall be equipped with a manual override feature so as to permit opening during power failures or other emergency.

100.05 APPLICATION AND APPROVAL PROCESS

- A. The applicant shall submit a detailed plan, including but not limited to, scaled drawings showing the location of the gates, turn radius, dimensions of the gates, pavement, sidewalks, curbs, etc. Information such as topography lines, vegetation, site triangles, etc. shall also be included with the submittal.
- B. The applicant shall submit these plans for review by the Planning & Inspections Department, who shall forward the plans to the Sheriff's Department, Fire Marshal's Office, EMS, and Local Fire Department for approval.
- C. The Department of Planning & Inspections shall verify approval by the agencies listed in Section 100.05 (b) of the gate plan prior to issuance of a permit.
- D. All property owners shall notify the Watauga County E911 Department of any gate access code changes prior to such changes taking effect.
- E. All gated communities applying for a permit to install a gate shall acknowledge that if the affected properties gate fails to operate in its intended operational capacity, and such failure results in damage to the gate or constitutes the responding emergency agency to alter normal entrance procedures, the responding agency, mutual aid departments and Watauga County shall not be held liable for damages incurred.

100.06 MAINTENANCE

Gates subject to this ordinance shall be kept in their original working order and shall be repaired and/or replaced in the event they are disabled and/or damaged. It shall not be the responsibility of the County to maintain these gates. Gates subject to this ordinance shall be monitored annually by the Local Fire Department and verified by the Watauga County Fire Marshal's Office every three (3) years of their operation or as deemed appropriate by the Watauga County Fire Marshal's Office.

100.07 MODIFICATIONS

Any gate (new or existing) altered outside the scope of their original installation and/or permitting, will be considered a modification. Notification and plans for modification shall be submitted to the Watauga County Office of Planning and Inspections for review and decision upon compliance with this ordinance.

100.08 VIOLATIONS

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person to construct, install, or maintain any blocking device, such as a gate or any other type of barrier without first review and approval by Watauga County.
- B. If it is found that a gated community is in violation of this ordinance, the property owners association shall be notified of said violation in writing by the Watauga County Fire Marshal's Office. Failure to remedy the violation within seven (7) business days shall subject the violator to remedies as authorized under G. S. 153A-123 and G.S. 143-139. Civil penalties shall be imposed in the amount of \$200.00 per day until the violation has been remedied. In addition to the civil penalty, or in the alternative, this ordinance may be enforced by injunction and order of abatement in the General Court of Justice. Each day's continuing violation of this ordinance is a separate and distinct offense.
- C. In the event the gated community does not have a property owners association or the association is defunct, insolvent, or otherwise non-responsive to a notice of violation, the county may pursue each individual lot owner for enforcement of the remedies as set forth above.

100.09 APPEAL PROCEDURE

The Watauga County Board of Adjustments shall hear all appeals which may be taken by an owner or other party in interest from any decision or order of the Watauga County Office of Planning and Inspections.

The appeal shall be taken within ten days from the service of the decision by the Watauga County Office of Planning and Inspections by filing with the Watauga County Director of Planning and Inspections a notice of appeal, which shall specify the grounds upon which the appeal is based. Upon the filing of any notice of appeal, the Watauga County Director of Planning and Inspections shall schedule the matter for hearing in accordance with the rules of procedure for the Watauga County Board of Adjustment. When an appeal is from the decision of the Watauga County Office of Planning and Inspections refusing to allow the person aggrieved thereby to do any act, this decision shall remain in force until modified or reversed.

When any appeal is from a decision of the Watauga County Office of Planning and Inspections requiring the person aggrieved to do any act, the appeal shall have the effect of suspending the requirement until the hearing of the Board, unless the Director of the Watauga County Office of Planning and Inspections certifies to the Board, after the notice of appeal is filed, that by reason of the facts stated in the certificate (a copy of which shall be furnished to the petitioner) a suspension of the requirement would, in his or her opinion, cause imminent peril to life or property or that because the violation charged is transitory in nature a stay would seriously interfere with enforcement of the

ordinance. In that case proceedings shall not be stayed except by a restraining order, which may be granted by the Board of Adjustment or by a court of record an application upon notice to the Director of the Watauga County Office of Planning and Inspections and in accordance with the requirement of Rule 65 of the North Carolina Rules of Civil Procedure.

- (b) The Watauga County Board of Adjustments shall have all the powers of the officer from whom the appeal is taken.
- (2) The Board shall fix a reasonable time for the hearing of appeals, shall give due notice to all the parties and shall render its decision within forty-five days of the conclusion of the evidence presented to it. Any party may appear in person or by agent or by attorney. The Board may reverse, affirm, in whole or in part, or may modify the decision or order appealed. The concurring vote of four-fifths members of the Board shall be necessary to reverse or modify any decision or order appealed under this Ordinance.

The Board shall have the power also in passing upon appeals in any case where there are practical difficulties or undue hardships in the way of carrying out the strict letter of this code, to adapt the application of the code to the necessities of the case to the end that the spirit of the code shall be observed, public safety and welfare secured, and substantial justice done.

(3) Every decision of the Board shall be subject to review by proceedings in the nature of certiorari instituted in the Watauga County Superior Court within 30 days after the written decision of the Board is filed or after a copy thereof is delivered to the appealing party, whichever is later. The decision of the Board may be delivered to the aggrieved party either by hand delivery or by any method authorized by the State Rules of Civil Procedure.

100.10 EFFECTIVE DATE

- 5. The applicant shall be required to provide documentation certifying compliance with all applicable Federal and State regulations.
- 6. The applicant shall present to the Ordinance Administrator proof of either fee simple ownership, an option to purchase or lease, a recorded leasehold interest, or an easement, from the record owner of all property involved and any necessary rightsof-way to the tower site.
- 7. A sign identifying the owner(s) and operator(s) of the tower and an emergency telephone number shall be placed in a clearly visible location on the premises of the tower.
- 8. When applicable, tower sites shall comply with the terms of the Watauga County Watershed Ordinance or the Foscoe/Grandfather Zoning Ordinance. No tower sites shall be located within the Valle Crucis Historic District.
- 9. All towers shall be set back from any surrounding property lines by a distance equal to the height of the tower unless a NC Registered Professional Engineer certifies the fall zone of the tower and appurtenances will be within the setback area proposed.
- 10. The tower shall be designed to meet the latest ANSI/EIA/TIA-222- standards as amended. of a minimum 100-year return wind speed and a minimum ½ inch of solid radial ice. In no case shall the design wind speed be less than specified in Table 1606.1 of the NC Building Code, Vol. 1. The foundation shall be designed in compliance with the NC Building Code, Chapter 18 as amended. Electrical design, as applicable, shall comply with the National Electrical Code as amended.
- 11. The tower and any necessary buildings or structures shall be surrounded by a commercial grade chain link secure fence at least eight (8) feet in height, which may include no more than two (2) feet of barbed wire.
- 12. Lighting on towers shall not be permitted except as required by Federal and State regulations. Towers shall be light gray or another earth tone (such as "environmental green"), except when specific colors and color patterns are required by Federal or State regulations.
- 13. When a tower is proposed adjacent to a residential area the setback space is to be used as a buffer zone and shall be landscaped as follows. Buffers shall consist of planting evergreen and/or deciduous trees spaced no more than thirty (30) feet apart. Such trees shall be a least six to seven (6-7) feet tall for evergreens and six to eight (6-8) feet tall with a one and one half (1-1/2) inch caliper (trunk measured six (6) inches above grade) for deciduous trees at time of planting and shall reach a height of no less than twenty (20) feet at maturity. In addition, planting of low growing shrubs, and/or trees shall be placed at ten (10) foot intervals. Plantings within buffer zones shall be staggered unless topography is prohibitive. The buffer zone shall not be in, and no planting shall be placed in, the road right-of-way.

VALLE CRUCIS HISTORIC DISTRICT ORDINANCE

APPLICANT: Valle Crucis Historic Preservation Commission

LOCATION: Valle Crucis, North Carolina

STAFF CONTACT: John Spear, AICP

BACKGROUND:

Valle Crucis was the first rural historic district designated in North Carolina. The Historic District Ordinance has been in effect since its original adoption effective September 1, 1990. It has been amended four times for various reasons.

INTENT:

This proposed amendment will allow low-level, external illumination of advertising signs when street or site lighting is insufficient; clarify staff's role in issuing Certificates of Appropriateness for advertising signs; and extend the validity of Certificates of Appropriateness from 6 months to 12 months.

The following areas of the Citizens' Plan for Watauga lend support to this request:

Pg. 43, Key Economic Sectors - recognize the importance of tourism as a key economic sector.

Pg. 57, Preservation of Unique Community Identities and Heritage - ensure the preservation and protection of the Valle Crucis Historic District.

PUBLIC HEARING AND NOTICE:

Prior to taking action on any proposed amendment, the board of commissioners must hold a duly advertised public hearing in accordance with NCGS §153A-323.

PLANNING BOARD RECOMMENDATION:

The planning board will review and comment on whether the proposed amendment is consistent with the Citizens' Plan for Watauga via a written recommendation addressing plan consistency in accordance with NCGS§153A-344.

RELATION TO CITIZENS PLAN FOR WATAUGA:

The board of commissioners shall consider the plan consistency statement along with public comment and other relevant information before making a final determination.

COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ACTION:

Prior to adopting or rejecting any proposed amendment, the board of commissioners shall adopt a statement of plan consistency and explain why the board considers the action taken to be reasonable and in the public interest. The plan consistency statement is required by NCGS §153A-341. Commissioners may take one of the following actions:

- a. Approval of the application.
- b. Approval of a modified version of the application.
- c. Denial of the application.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS:

Please Note:

- 1. Proposed amendments are shown high-lighted in yellow.
- 2. Existing text to be removed is shown struck through.
- 3. New text is shown in **bold** print.

2.5 Performance Standards

e. Signage

In order to maintain the rural historic character of the District, signs must be limited in size and number. Therefore, off-premises advertising signs are prohibited. On-premises signs are limited as follows:

- a) Signs shall not be placed within a public road right-of-way.
- b) Signs located fifteen (15) feet to twenty five (25) feet from the centerline of a road shall be limited to ten (10) square feet in size.
- c) Signs located twenty five (25) to thirty five (35) feet from the centerline of a road shall be limited to twenty (20) square feet in size.
- d) Signs located thirty five (35) feet or more from the centerline of a road shall have a maximum size of thirty two (32) square feet.
- e) Each establishment is limited to a maximum of two signs (one (1) detached and one (1) attached). However, in a situation where a detached sign is not visible from both directions due to topography or other obstruction, two (2) detached signs may be permitted and shall have a maximum size of ten (10) square feet each.
- f) The maximum height of detached signs is ten (10) feet measured from the ground.

EXISTING g) Signs shall not be lighted by either interior or exterior illumination.

PROPOSED

g) Signs shall not be internally illuminated – i.e. translucent plastic signs prohibited. h) Where street or site lighting does not provide sufficient illumination, signs may be externally illuminated by low level, shielded stationary bulbs installed in compliance with North Carolina Statutes §136-32.2. Sign lighting shall be turned off at 11 pm.

2.8 Certificate of Appropriateness

a. Required

No exterior portion of any building or other structure (including masonry walls, fences, light fixtures, steps and pavement or other appurtenant features) nor above ground utility structure nor any type of outdoor advertising sign shall be erected, altered, restored, moved or demolished within the Valle Crucis Historic District until after an application for a Certificate of Appropriateness as to exterior features has been submitted to and approved by the Valle Crucis Historic Preservation Commission.

EXISTING

(Staff Note: The planning staff has historically issued sign permits in the Historic District following the Historic Preservation Commission's adopted Rules of Procedure. The intent of this amendment is to clarify and maintain the staff's role in issuing sign permits within the District).

2.14 Compliance

Compliance with the terms of the Certificate of Appropriateness shall be enforced by the Watauga County Department of Planning and Inspections.

Failure to comply with a Certificate of Appropriateness shall be a violation of this Ordinance.

EXISTING

The discontinuance of work or the lack of progress towards achieving compliance with a Certificate of Appropriateness for a period of six months shall be considered as failure to comply with a Certificate of Appropriateness.

PROPOSED

To ensure continued compliance with the provisions of this ordinance, each approved certificate of appropriateness shall expire 12 months from the date on which final action was taken to approve the application, unless otherwise identified in the certificate, if the alteration, construction, demolition, relocation, or removal has not been initiated. Time extensions may be granted in accordance with the Commission's Rules of Procedure Section 10.17.

Nothing contained in this Ordinance shall prohibit, impair or limit in any way the power of Watauga County to prevent the construction, reconstruction, alteration, or removal of building structures, appurtenant fixtures or outdoor signs in the Historic District in violation of the provisions of this Ordinance.

The enforcement of any remedy already provided herein shall not prevent the enforcement of any other remedy or remedies provided herein or in any other ordinances or laws. (See North Carolina General Statutes 160A-175 and 160A-389)

SAMPLE STATEMENTS OF PLAN CONSISTENCY:

Planning Board

The planning board finds the proposed zoning text amendments consistent with the findings and recommendations of the Citizens' Plan for Watauga. The board members therefore recommend approval because:

- 1. Advertising signage is critical to the success of local merchants who rely on tourism, a key economic sector.
- 2. Sign lighting provides guidance and informs both visitors and residents after dark.
- 3. Tasteful, low-level exterior illumination is consistent with the Rural Historic District Guidelines for Valle Crucis.

Appropriation of State Funds for Senior Centers

The Project on Aging received notification that each of the County's two senior centers are eligible to receive Senior Center General Purpose funding in the amount of \$15,670 on a reimbursement basis through an appropriation from the NC General Assembly and the Division of Aging. The L. E. Harrill Senior Center, as a Center of Excellence, is eligible to receive \$11,753, which requires a 25% local match of \$3,918. The Western Watauga Community Center is eligible to receive \$3,917, which requires a 25% local match of \$1,306. The required match is present in the agency's budget.

These funds can be used for senior center operations including salaries, supplies, equipment, capital outlay, and other operating costs. We plan to use the funds to expand classes at both centers, as well as other various ongoing expenses.

I recommend acceptance of these funds. I will plan to be present for discussion and questions.

COMMERCIAL LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS LEASE, made this1st day of September, 2012, by and between Watauga County, a body politic of the State of North Carolina (hereinafter referred to as "Landlord" and/or "County") whose address is 814 West King Street, Suite 205, Boone, North Carolina 28607, and Appalachian State University (hereinafter referred to as "Tenant" and/or "ASU"), a constituent institution of The University of North Carolina, whose address is 438 Academy Street, B.B. Dougherty Administration Building, Boone, North Carolina, 28608.

WHEREAS, County and Appalachian State University Foundation, Inc. (ASUF), entered into a lease of space adjacent to the County's Methane Flare Stations to facilitate ASU's establishment of a greenhouse for a demonstration project, creating biodiesel from algae cultivation as of May 13, 2010; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to lease property to ASU for the above stated purpose, subject to the following terms and conditions.

WITNESSETH:

1. LEASED PREMISES

The County, for and in consideration of the rents, covenants, agreements, and stipulations hereinafter mentioned, provided for and covenanted to be paid, kept and performed by ASU, leases and rents unto ASU, and ASU hereby leases and takes upon the terms and conditions which hereinafter appear, the following described property (hereinafter called the "Premises"), to wit:

Beginning at a point two (2) feet from Landfill Rd. directly south of the power pole providing service to the Watauga County Animal Control Office, proceeding east along Landfill Rd. 160 feet and heading due south from those two points to the Watauga County property line.

2. TERM.

ASU shall have and hold the Premises for a term of three (3) years beginning on the 1st day of September, 2012, and ending on the 31st day of August, 2015, at midnight, unless sooner terminated as hereinafter provided.

3. RENTAL

ASU agrees to pay the County, without deduction or set off, an annual rental of One Dollar (\$1.00) per year, payable on the first day of each calendar year during the term hereof. Upon execution of this Lease, ASU shall pay to the County the first month's rent due hereunder. Rental for any period during the term hereof which is less than one month shall be the pro-rated portion of the monthly rental due.

4. UTILITIES

- (a) ASU shall pay the following utilities: Electric and any other utility associated with ASU's use of the property.
 - There is an unused electrical meter box that previously provided service to the blower/flare station. ASU will be responsible for contacting the utility company serving the site to set up an account and shall be responsible for all utilities associated with its use of the property;
 - ii. ASU will be responsible for contacting the Town of Boone to tap into the water line.
- (b) The County shall pay the following utilities: None.

Responsibility to pay for a utility service shall include all metering, hook-up fees or other miscellaneous charges associated with the installation and maintenance of such utility in said party's name.

5. COMMON AREA RULES AND REGULATIONS

ASU shall be subject to Rules and Regulations for the common areas of the County property as may be made from time to time by the County.

6. USE OF PREMISES

The Premises shall be used to: build and operate a prototype greenhouse and to conduct research on biofuel production and for no other purpose. The Premises shall not be used for any illegal purposes, nor in any manner to create any nuisance or trespass, nor in any manner to vitiate the insurance or increase the rate of insurance on the Premises. In the event ASU's use of the Premises results in an increase in the rate of insurance on the Premises, ASU shall pay to The County, upon demand and as additional rental, the amount of any such increase.

7. NOVATION

The parties intend and agree that this lease shall constitute a novation of that certain lease agreement by and between County and ASUF dated May 13, 2010.

8. REPAIRS BY THE COUNTY

The premises are being rented "as is" and the County shall have no obligation to repair any improvements thereon during the term of this lease.

9. REPAIRS BY ASU

ASU accepts the Premises in their present condition and as suited for the uses intended by ASU. ASU shall, throughout the initial term of this Lease, and any extension or renewal thereof, at its expense, maintain in good order and repair the Premises.

10. ALTERATIONS

ASU shall not make any alterations, additions, or improvements to the Premises without the County's prior written consent. ASU shall promptly remove any alterations, additions, or improvements constructed in violation of this Paragraph upon the County's written request. All approved alterations, additions, and improvements will be accomplished in a good and workmanlike manner, in conformity will all applicable laws and regulations, free of any liens or encumbrances. The County may require ASU to remove any alterations, additions or improvements (whether or not made with the County's consent) at the termination of the Lease and to restore the Premises to its prior condition, all at ASU's expense. All alterations, additions and improvements which the County has not required ASU to remove shall become the County's property and shall be surrendered to the County upon the termination of this Lease, except that ASU may remove any of ASU's machinery, trade fixtures or equipment which can be removed without material damage to the Premises. ASU shall repair, at ASU's expense, any damage to the Premises caused by the removal of any such machinery, trade fixtures or equipment.

11. REMOVAL OF FIXTURES

ASU may (if not in default hereunder) prior to the expiration of this Lease, or any extension or renewal thereof, remove all fixtures and equipment which it has placed in the Premises, provided ASU repairs all damage to the Premises caused by such removal.

12. GOVERNMENTAL ORDERS

ASU agrees, at its own expense, to comply promptly with all requirements of any legally constituted public authority made necessary by reason of ASU's occupancy of the Premises. The County agrees to comply promptly with any such requirements if not made necessary by reason of ASU's occupancy. It is mutually agreed, however, between the County and ASU, that if in order to comply with such requirements, the cost to the County or ASU, as the case may be, shall exceed a sum which the respective party desires to pay, then the County or ASU, whichever is obligated to comply with such requirements, may terminate this Lease by giving written notice of termination to the other party by registered mail, which termination shall become effective sixty (60) days after receipt of such notice and which notice shall eliminate the necessity of compliance with such requirements by giving such notice.

13. ASSIGNMENT AND SUBLETTING

ASU shall not, without the prior written consent of the County, which shall not be unreasonably

withheld, assign this Lease or any interest hereunder, or sublet the Premises or any part thereof, or permit the use of the Premises by any party other than the ASU. Consent to any assignment or sublease shall not impair this provision and all later assignments or subleases shall be made likewise only on the prior written consent of the County. The Assignee of ASU, at option of the County, shall become directly liable to the County for all obligations of ASU hereunder, but no sublease or assignment by ASU shall relieve ASU of any liability hereunder.

14. EVENTS OF DEFAULT

The happening of any one or more of the following events (hereinafter any one of which may be referred to as an "Event of Default") during the term of this Lease, or any renewal or extension thereof, shall constitute a breach of this Lease on the part of the ASU: (a) ASU fails to pay the rental as provided for herein; (b) ASU abandons or vacates the Premises; and/or (c) ASU fails to comply with or abide by and perform any other obligation imposed upon ASU under this Lease.

15. REMEDIES UPON DEFAULT

Upon the occurrence of Event of Default, The County may pursue any one or more of the following remedies separately or concurrently, without prejudice to any other remedy herein provided or provided by law; (a) if the Event of Default involves nonpayment of rental and ASU fails to cure such default with five (5) days after receipt of written notice thereof from the County, or if the Event of Default involves a default in performing any of the terms or provisions of this Lease other than the payment of rental and ASU fails to cure such default within fifteen (15) days after receipt of written notice of default from the County, the County may terminate this Lease by giving written notice to ASU and upon such termination shall be entitled to recover from ASU damages as may be permitted under applicable law; or (b) if the Event of Default involves any manner other than those set forth in item (a) of this paragraph, The County may terminate this Lease by giving written notice to ASU. In the event The County hires an attorney to enforce its rights upon default, ASU shall in addition be liable for reasonable attorney's fees and all costs of collection.

16. EXTERIOR SIGNS

ASU shall place no signs on the Premises, except with the express written consent of the County. Any and all signs placed on the Premises by ASU shall be maintained in compliance with governmental rules and regulations governing such signs and ASU shall be responsible to the County for any damage caused by installation, use or maintenance of said signs, and all damage incident to removal thereof.

17. THE COUNTY'S ENTRY OF PREMISES

The County may enter the Premises for any reasonable and necessary purpose, provided it is during reasonable hours.

18. WAIVER OF RIGHTS

No failure of the County to exercise any power given the County hereunder or to insist upon strict compliance by ASU of its obligations hereunder and no custom or practice of the parties at variance with the terms hereof shall constitute a waiver of the County's right to demand exact compliance with the terms hereof.

19. ENVIRONMENTAL LAWS

- without the prior written approval by the County. Any approval must be preceded by submission to the County of appropriate Material Safety Data Sheets (MSD Sheets). In the event of approval by the County, ASU covenants that it will (1) comply with all requirements of any constituted public authority and all federal, state, and local codes, statutes ordinances, rules and regulations, and laws, whether now in force or hereafter adopted relating to ASU's use of the Premises, or relating to the storage, use, disposal, processing, distribution, shipping or sales of any hazardous, flammable, toxic, or dangerous materials, waste or substance, the presence of which is regulated by a federal, state, or local law, ruling, rule or regulation (hereafter collectively referred to as "Hazardous Materials"); (2) comply with any reasonable recommendations by the insurance carrier of either the County or ASU relating to the use by ASU on the Premises of such Hazardous Materials; (3) refrain from unlawfully disposing of or allowing the disposal of any Hazardous Materials upon, within, about or under the Premises; and (4) remove all Hazardous Materials from the Premises, either after their use by ASU or upon the expiration or earlier termination of this lease, in compliance with all applicable laws.
- (b) ASU shall be responsible for obtaining all necessary permits in connection with its use, storage and disposal of Hazardous Materials, and shall develop and maintain, and where necessary file with the appropriate authorities, all reports, receipts, manifest, filings, lists and invoices covering those Hazardous Materials and ASU shall provide the County with copies of all such items upon request ASU shall provide within five (5) days after receipt thereof, copies of all notices, orders, claims or other correspondence from any federal, state or local government or agency alleging any violation of any environmental law or regulation by ASU, or related in any manner to Hazardous Materials. In addition, ASU shall provide the County with copies of all responses to such correspondence at the time of the response.
- (c) If ASU fails to comply with the Covenants to be performed hereunder with respect to Hazardous materials, or if an environmental protection lien is filed against the premises as a result of the actions of ASU, its agents, employees or invitees, then the occurrence of any such events shall be considered a default hereunder.
- (d) ASU will give The County prompt notice of any release of Hazardous Materials, reportable or non-reportable, to federal, state or local authorities, of any fire, or any damage occurring on or to the Premises.
 - (e) ASU will use and occupy the Premises and conduct its business in such a manner that

the Premises are neat, clean and orderly at all times with all chemicals or Hazardous Materials marked for easy identification and stored according to all codes as outlined above.

(f) The warranties and indemnities contained in this Paragraph shall survive the termination of this Lease.

20. ABANDONMENT

ASU shall not abandon the Premises at any time during the Lease term. If ASU shall abandon the premises or be dispossessed by process of law, any Personal Property belonging to ASU and left on the Premises shall, at the option of the County, be deemed abandoned, and available to the County to use or sell to offset any rent due or any expenses incurred by removing same and restoring the Premises.

21. DEFINITIONS

"The County" as used in this Lease shall include the undersigned, its representatives, assigns and successors in title to the Premises. "Agent" as used in this Lease shall mean the party designated as same in Paragraph 22, its representatives, assigns and successors. "ASU" shall include the undersigned and its representatives, assigns and successors, and if this lease shall be validly assigned or sublet, shall include also ASU's assignees or sublessees as to the Premises covered by such assignment or sublease the "County", "ASU", and "Agent" include male and female, singular and plural, corporation, partnership or individual, as may fit the particular parties.

22. NOTICES

All notices required or permitted under this Lease shall be in writing and shall be personally delivered or sent by U.S. certified mail, return-receipt requested, postage prepaid. Notices to ASU shall be delivered or sent to the address shown at the beginning of this Lease, with a copy to Office of General Counsel, Appalachian State University, ASU Box 32126, Boone, North Carolina 28608. Notices to the County shall be delivered or sent to the address shown at the beginning of this Lease.

All notices shall be effective upon delivery. Any party may change its notice address upon written notice to the other parties, given as provided herein.

23. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Lease contains the entire agreement of the parties hereto, and no representations, inducements, promises or agreements, oral or otherwise, between the parties, not embodied herein shall be of any force or effect. This Lease may not be modified except by a writing signed by all the parties hereto.

24. AUTHORIZED LEASE EXECUTION

Each individual executing this Lease as director, officer or agent of a party hereto represents and warrants that he/she is duly authorized to execute and deliver this Lease on behalf of such party.

25. SPECIAL STIPULATIONS

Any special stipulations are set forth below. Insofar as said Special Stipulations conflict with any of the foregoing provisions, said Special Stipulations shall control.

a. It is understood and agreed by the parties that the greenhouse would be accessed by faculty and students during regular hours of operation, being Monday- Friday, from 8:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m., and Saturday from 8:00a.m. until noon.

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into on the last date executed below, by and between the North Carolina Department of Transportation, an agency of the State of North Carolina, hereinafter referred to as the "Department", the County of Watauga, hereinafter referred to as the "County" and Meat Camp Volunteer Fire Department, hereinafter referred to as the "VFD.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties have agreed to make certain improvements within the County under WBS Element 11C.095095 in Watauga County in accordance with the plans and specifications approved by the Department; and,

WHEREAS, this Agreement is made under the authority granted to the Department by the North Carolina General Assembly including, but not limited to, the following applicable legislation: General Statutes of North Carolina (NCGS) Section 136-66.1, Section 136-66.3, Section 136-18 (24) and (27), Section 20-169, Section 160A-296 and Section 297, to participate in the planning and construction of the Project approved by the Board of Transportation for the safe and efficient utilization of transportation systems for the public good; and,

WHEREAS, the Department, County and VFD have agreed that the jurisdictional limits of the Parties, as of the date of the awarding of the contract for the construction of the above-mentioned Project, are to be used in determining the duties, responsibilities, rights and legal obligations of the parties hereto for the purposes of this Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, the parties to this Agreement have approved the construction of said Project with cost participation and responsibilities for the Project as hereinafter set out.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto, each in consideration of the promises and undertakings of the other as herein provided, do hereby covenant and agree, each with the other, as follows:

SCOPE OF PROJECT

 The Project consists of paving the entrance to the bay doors at the new Meat Camp Volunteer Fire Department located on NC 194 in Boone, (hereinafter the "Project").

PROCUREMENT OF SPECIALIZED SERVICES

- 2. If the County and/or VFD causes the professional engineering services required by this Agreement to be performed by contracting with a private engineering firm and seeks reimbursement for said services under this agreement, it is agreed as follows:
 - A. The County and/or VFD shall ensure that an engineering firm is obtained through an equitable selection process and that prescribed work is properly accomplished in a timely manner, at a just and reasonable cost.
 - B. The County and/or VFD, when procuring architectural, professional and engineering services, must adhere to North Carolina Department of Transportation Policies and Procedures for Major Professional or Specialized Services Contracts. This policy conforms to N.C.G.S. 143-64, Parts 31 and 32.
 - C. The County and/or VFD shall submit all professional services contract proposals to the Department for review and approval prior to execution of the professional services contract by the County and/or VFD. In the event that the professional services contract proposal (engineering) exceeds \$30,000, a pre-negotiation audit must be requested from the Department's External Audit Branch. A pre-negotiation audit of a contract under \$30,000 will be performed by the Department's External Audit Branch if the County and/or VFD request it.
 - D. Reimbursement for construction administration costs cannot exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the actual construction contract cost. This applies to private engineering firms and/or work performed by the County and/or VFD. If the County and/or VFD elects to procure a private

consulting firm to conduct Project administration, the County and/or VFD shall be responsible for submitting the consulting firm's proposal to the Division Engineer for review and approval. The County, and/or VFD and/or its agent, shall perform Project administration in accordance with all Departmental policies and procedures.

- E. All work shall be prepared and submitted using computer software and applications approved by the Department and compatible with departmental equipment and programs.
- F. Small Professional and Engineering Services Requirements: Any contract entered into with another party to perform work associated with the requirements of this agreement shall contain appropriate provisions regarding the utilization of Small Professional Services Firms (SPSF). This policy conforms with the SPSF Guidelines as approved by the NC Board of Transportation. These provisions are incorporated into this Agreement by reference www.ncdot.org/doh/preconstruct/ps/contracts/sp/2006sp/municipal.html
 - The County and/or VFD shall not advertise nor enter into a contract for services performed as part of this Agreement, unless the Department provides written approval of the advertisement or the contents of the contract.
 - If the County and/or VFD fails to comply with these requirements, the Department will withhold funding until these requirements are met.

PLANNING AND DESIGN

- The County, and/or VFD and/or its consultant, shall prepare the environmental and/or planning
 document and obtain any environmental permits needed for the Project. All work shall be done in
 accordance with departmental standards, specifications, policies and procedures.
- 4. The County and/or VFD shall design and prepare the plans and specifications for the Project, in accordance with the Department's standard practices, regulations and guidelines for transportation improvements. The Department shall review and approve Project plans and specifications.

UTILITIES

5. The County and/or VFD, without any cost or liability whatsoever to the Department, shall relocate and adjust all utilities in conflict with the Project. All utility work shall be performed in a manner satisfactory to and in conformance with rules and regulations of the Department prior to the County and/or VFD beginning construction of the Project. The County and/or VFD shall make all necessary adjustments to house or lot connections or services lying within the right of way or construction limits of the Project, whichever is greater, regardless of ownership of the connections or services. Any encroachment agreement and/or permits required for the Project must be obtained from the Division Office. All work shall be performed in accordance with the Department's approved Utility Relocation Policy and standard procedures for utility improvements.

RIGHT OF WAY

6. The County and/or VFD, at no expense or liability whatsoever to the Department, shall be responsible for acquiring any needed right of way and/or permanent easements required for said Project. If the Project is not to be constructed within the existing right of way, the County and/or VFD will be responsible for any additional right of way or easements. Acquisition of right of way shall be accomplished in accordance with applicable policies, guidelines, statutes and the North Carolina Department of Transportation Right of Way Manual.

The County and/or VFD shall remove from said right of way all obstructions and encroachments of any kind or character (including hazardous and contaminated materials). The County and/or VFD shall indemnify and save harmless the Department from any and all claims for damages that might arise on account of said right of way acquisition, and construction easements for the construction of said Project.

CONSTRUCTION

7. The County and/or VFD shall construct, or cause to be constructed, the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications of said Project as filed with, and approved by, the Department. The County and/or VFD shall enter into and shall administer the construction contract for said Project and the procedures set out herein below shall be followed:

- A. Prior to advertising the Project for construction bids, the County and/or VFD or its agents, shall submit for approval by the Department, the final construction plans, the total contract proposal, and an estimate of the Project costs to the Division Engineer. Bids received along with proper documentation of Municipal approval shall be submitted to the Division Engineer for review and approval by the Department prior to the contract being awarded by the County and/or VFD. Upon award of the Project, the County and/or VFD shall provide the Division Project Manager copies of the executed contract and sets of plans as requested.
- B. The County and/or VFD shall follow Department regulations, and North Carolina General Statutes regulations pertaining to bid procedures in the award of the contract and purchases. The County and/or VFD shall not enter into any contractual agreement for any phase of the Project without prior written approval from the Department.
- C. The construction engineering and supervision will be furnished by the County and/or VFD. Said work shall be accomplished in accordance with terms set out in Provision #2 of this Agreement.
- D. The Department's Division Engineer shall have the right to inspect, sample, test, and approve or reject any portion of the Project being performed by the County and/or VFD or the County's contractor, to ensure compliance with the provisions of this Agreement. The Department will furnish the County and/or VFD with any forms that may be needed in order to follow standard Departmental practices and procedures in the administration and performance of the contract.
- E. The County and/or VFD shall sample and test all materials in reasonable close conformity with the Department's Guide for Process Control and Acceptance Sampling and Testing. The Division Engineer shall be provided a copy of the testing results.
- F. During construction of the Project, if any changes in the plans are necessary, such changes must be approved by the Division Engineer prior to the work being performed.
- G. All materials incorporated in the Project and workmanship performed by the contractor shall be in reasonable close conformity with the Standards and Specifications of the Department.
- H. Upon completion of the Project, the County and/or VFD shall furnish the Division Engineer with complete sets of "Plan of Record" and/or "As Built" plans as requested.

- Prior to the final acceptance and payment by the Department, the Division Engineer shall
 make a final inspection of the completed work. The Division Engineer will be responsible for
 final acceptance of the completed work on behalf of the Department.
- J. During construction of the Project, the County and/or VFD shall provide and maintain adequate barricades, signs, signal lights, flagmen, and other warning devices for the protection of traffic in conformation with standards and specifications of the Department and the current edition of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways published by the Federal Highway Administration.
- K. In the event the Project is not let to contract within six (6) months after receiving final approval of construction plans and proposals from the Department, the County and/or VFD shall be responsible for documenting to the Department justification for project delay and that the Project remains in compliance with the terms of this Agreement, the approved plans and specifications, and current codes.
- L. The County and/or VFD shall complete construction of the Project, in accordance with the terms of this Agreement within one year(s) of execution of this Agreement. If the County and/or VFD has not completed its responsibilities to the satisfaction of the Department, including satisfactory progress of the various phases of the Project, the unexpended balance of funds may be recalled by the Department and assigned to other Projects by the Board of Transportation and the County and/or VFD shall reimburse costs incurred by the Department associated with the Project.

CONSTRUCTION SUBCONTRACTOR GUIDELINES

- 8. Any construction contract entered into with another party to perform work associated with the requirements of this Agreement shall contain appropriate provisions regarding the utilization of Minority Businesses and Women Businesses as required by GS 136-28.4 and the North Carolina Administrative Code.
 - A. The Department will provide the appropriate provisions to be contained in those contracts. Those provisions are available on the Department's website at www.ncdot.org/doh/preconstruct/ps/contracts/sp/2006sp/municipal. html

- B. No advertisement shall be made nor any contract be entered into for services to be performed as part of this Agreement without prior written approval of the advertisement or contents of the contract by the Department.
- C. Failure to comply with these requirements will result in funding being withheld until such time as these requirements are met.

FUNDING

- A. Subject to compliance by the County and/or VFD with the provisions set forth in this Agreement, and the availability of funds, the Department shall participate in the actual Construction costs up to a maximum amount of \$25,000 (estimated costs are \$25,000). Costs which exceed this amount shall be borne by the County and/or VFD. Reimbursement to the County and/or VFD shall be made upon approval of the invoice by the Department's Division Engineer and the Department's Fiscal Section.
- B. The County and/or VFD may bill the Department for actual costs by submitting an itemized invoice and requested documentation to the Department. Reimbursement shall be made upon completion. By submittal of said invoice, the County and/or VFD certifies that it has adhered to all applicable state laws and regulations as set forth in this Agreement.
- C. Force account work is only allowed when there is a finding of cost effectiveness for the work to be performed by some method other than contract awarded by competitive bidding process. Written approval from the Division Engineer is required prior to the use of force account by the County and/or VFD. Said invoices for force account work shall show a summary of labor, labor additives, equipment, materials and other qualifying costs in conformance with the standards for allowable costs set forth in Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular A-87 (www.whitehouse.gov/omb/circulars/a087/a087.html). Reimbursement shall be based on actual cost incurred with the exception of equipment owned by the County and/or VFD or its Project partners. Reimbursement rates for equipment owned by the County and/or VFD or its Project partners cannot exceed the Department's rates in effect for the time period in which the work is performed.
- D. In accordance with OMB Circular A-133, "Audits of States, Local Governments and Non-Profit Organizations" (www.whitehouse.gov/omb/circulars/a133/a133.html) dated June 27, 2003, the County and/or VFD shall arrange for an annual independent financial and compliance audit of its fiscal operations. The County and/or VFD shall furnish the Department with a copy of the annual independent audit report within thirty (30) days of

- completion of the report, but not later than nine (9) months after the County's and/or VFD's fiscal year ends.
- E. The County and/or VFD shall maintain all books, documents, papers, accounting records, and such other evidence as may be appropriate to substantiate costs incurred under this Agreement. Further, the County and/or VFD shall make such materials available at its office at all reasonable times during the contract period, and for five (5) years from the date of final payment under this Agreement, for inspection and audit by the Department's Fiscal Section.
- F. The County and/or VFD agree that it shall bear all costs for which it is unable to substantiate actual costs.
- G. Failure on the part of the County and/or VFD to comply with any of these provisions will be grounds for the Department to terminate participation in the costs of the Project.
- H. All invoices associated with the Project must be submitted within six months of the completion of the Project to be eligible for reimbursement by the Department.
- The Project must progress in a satisfactory manner as determined by the Department. If the
 Project does not remain active, the Department reserves the right to de-obligate said funding.
- J. The expenses incurred by the Department for reviews, approvals, inspections and other tasks set forth in this Agreement are an eligible Project cost and charged to allocated Project funding.

TRAFFIC

9. All traffic operating controls and devices shall be established, enforced, and installed in accordance with the North Carolina General Statutes, the latest edition of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways, the latest edition of the "Policy on Street and Driveway Access to North Carolina Highways", and maintained and controlled by the Department upon completion of the Project.

MAINTENANCE

10. Upon completion of the Project, only those improvements within the state owned right of way shall be considered on the State Highway System and owned and maintained by the Department.

ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS

- 11. This Agreement is solely for the benefit of the identified parties to the Agreement and is not intended to give any rights, claims, or benefits to third parties or to the public at large.
- 12. It is the policy of the Department not to enter into any agreement with parties that have been debarred by any government agency. By execution of this Agreement, the County and/or VFD certifies, that neither it nor its agents or contractors are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by a governmental department or agency.
- 13. The County and/or VFD shall certify to the Department compliance with all applicable State laws and regulations and ordinances and shall indemnify the Department against any fines, assessments or other penalties resulting from noncompliance by the County and/or VFD or any entity performing work under contract with the County and/or VFD.
- 14. The County and/or VFD are solely responsible for all agreements, contracts, and work orders entered into or issued by the County and/or VFD for this Project. The Department is not responsible, for any expenses or obligations incurred for the Project except those specifically eligible in the terms of this Agreement. However, at no time shall the Department reimburse the County costs which exceed the total funding for this Project.
- 15. The County and/or VFD will indemnify and hold harmless the Department and the State of North Carolina, their respective officers, directors, principals, employees, agents, successors, and assigns from and against any and all claims for damage and/or liability in connection with the Project activities performed pursuant to this Agreement including construction of the Project. The Department shall not be responsible for any damages claims, which may be initiated by third parties.
- 16. The Department must approve any assignment or transfer of the responsibilities of the County and/or VFD set forth in this Agreement to other parties or entities.
- 17. If the County and/or VFD decide to terminate the Project without the concurrence of the Department, the County shall reimburse the Department one hundred percent (100%) of all costs expended by the Department and associated with the Project. Any notification of termination of this Project shall be in writing to the other party. Reimbursement to the Department shall be

made in one lump sum payment within sixty (60) days of billing. A late payment penalty and interest shall be charged on any unpaid balance due in accordance with G.S. 147-86.23 and G.S. 105-241.21.

- 18. In compliance with state policy, the County and/or VFD, and/or its agent, including all contractors, subcontractors, or sub-recipients shall have a Conflict of Interest Policy and adhere to the Department's Women Business Enterprise (WBE) and Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) policy which requires goals to be set and participation to be reported, as more fully described in the Subcontractor Guidelines section of this Agreement.
- 19. All terms and conditions of this Agreement are dependent upon, and subject to, the allocation of funds for the purpose set forth in the Agreement and the Agreement shall automatically terminate if funds cease to be available.
- 20. "By Executive Order 24, issued by Governor Perdue, and N.C. G.S.§ 133-32, it is unlawful for any vendor or contractor (i.e. architect, bidder, contractor, construction manager, design professional, engineer, landlord, offeror, seller, subcontractor, supplier, or vendor), to make gifts or to give favors to any State employee of the Governor's Cabinet Agencies (i.e., Administration, Commerce, Correction, Crime Control and Public Safety, Cultural Resources, Environment and Natural Resources, Health and Human Services, Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, Revenue, Transportation, and the Office of the Governor).

IT IS UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED that the approval of the Project by the Department is subject to the conditions of this Agreement and that no expenditure of funds on the part of the Department will be made until the terms of this Agreement have been complied with on the part of the County and/or VFD.
